At our January meeting, Tina Moore, an accomplished artist will be doing a pastel demonstration. Tina began painting as a pre-teen, progressing through various mediums until she found pastel which became her passion. To this day, pastels continue to be her first and best love although the world of oils beckons to her powerfully. Her genres range from animal to portraiture, landscape and floral. She effectively employs a number of different mediums and is responsible for all phases of her creations from concept to final presentation. Tina received an AA degree from Stephens College and BA degree in Art and Psychology from UOP. A Masters in Special Education soon followed. Tina retired from teaching five years ago having taught at all levels below university. Her last ten years in the profession were spent as a teacher of blind and visually impaired students. Her impressive career included being named a Mentor Teacher and a national presenter for Family Reading. She now devotes full time to art.

Art lovers are continually impressed by Tina's singular ability to capture a subject. As a realistic artist she has always sought to express and communicate the warmth and vibrancy of life. Animals and people, particularly faces, have always fascinated her and are the subjects of her best works. Her recent works exhibit a more daring exuberant use of color to enhance the viewer's visual experience. With ample time to paint, she is moving more fully throughout the spectrum.

Tina has works in many private collections throughout the United Stated and Canada and has done commissions for a variety of organizations. She is an award winner in local, regional, national and international shows, including several Best of Show Awards. She was accepted into the Pastel Society of America's annual show in New York City and received three awards in The Pastel Journal's annual competition, and those painting were featured in their April 2005 edition. Tina was chosen again for the Pastel Journal's competition of 2008, and has been an award winner in the Women Artists of the West Exhibits since 2009.

Tina is a Signature member of the Pastel Society of America. She is a Distinguished Pastel artist and Signature Member of the Pastel Society of the West Coast and the Sierra Pastel Society, Corporate Secretary and Signature Member of Women Artists of the West as well as a member of the Portrait Society of America. Carolyn Macpherson

Carolyn will present the topic: "The Joy of Painting Watercolor on Slick Surfaces and How to Control the Chaos". She will demonstrate how to control your watercolor on slick surfaces such as hot press and Yupo paper. Sounds informative and fun.

Combining a lifelong fascination with color, photography and design, Carolyn has explored several media in her 30 years as an artist. Her early art studies were at Lewis and Clark College in Portland, Oregon, where she obtained an art teaching credential so that she could share her fascination with college students. She taught design principles, calligraphy and painting at a small junior college in Longview, Washington. She exhibited widely around the state in her primary medium at the time, a combination of oil and collage used to create abstract landscape and garnered a number of regional art show awards

While in Washington, Carolyn was active in arts organizations and was elected to the Washington State Arts Advocacy Commission in 1976. For seven years she directed the second largest regional art show in the state, the Southwest Washington Arts Festival. Her philosophy has been that volunteering in the arts, rubbing elbows with artists and people who love art, keeps an artist's perspective fresh and challenged.

While spending two colorful years in Venezuela, she discovered she was allergic to oil paints, and made a difficult but necessary switch to watercolor. One last successful oil painting art show in Puerto Ordaz brought her a ticket back home to the States where she studied watercolor with Bill Colby, a well known Tacoma artist. Seeking a sunnier climate than Washington after her hiatus in the tropics, she moved to California in 1980 where she became an active member of the San Mateo Arts council. Living in the stressful environment of the Bay Area caused her to feel her art career was 'on hold'. She had a full time job as Executive Director of the Bay Area Camp Fire Council for five years, which left little time for art development. So, like many couples seeking a quieter life and the 'romance of the Sierra', she and her husband, Richard, moved to Arnold in 1988. Upon arriving in the foothills and finding that the Arts Council here was somewhat floundering, she became involved again as a volunteer. She served as the council's president for two years and was one of the original founders of the Art-Op Gallery in Murphys.

Currently, Carolyn's watercolors and photography reflect her surroundings-Mother lode thunder clouds, golden hills, brightly colored birds and flowers interpreted representational through wet, transparent watercolors and sharp focus photographs, with an occasional abstract impression thrown in for variety. Her pouring technique, used for the background of everything from koi fish, portraits, and skies to florals, has become the signature for her style. Carolyn's watercolor floral of irises is published in the book, *How Did You Paint That?* She has won numerous first place awards at juried art shows in Northern California.
