Minutes of the Mother Lode Art Association Meeting for June 15, 2015 By Linda Happel

The meeting was called to order by Linda Happel at 1:08 pm. The minutes of the last meeting and the Treasurer's Report were on the front table but not read as Secrretary and Treasurer were not available. No additions or

corrections were made

It was announced that we need a new Newsletter Editor as Irene Taylor relocated to Nevada. Members were urged to think about it and to contact either Linda Happel or Renetta Hayes if they wish to volunteer. Rich Linville,

the husband of Sulastri, volunteered to take this position.

Also, it was stated that there would be no meeting in July because of the show at the Sonora Fair, Creekside. We would be meeting in August when Dale Laitinen would be available to do a presentation. Minutes of the Mother Lode Art Association Meeting for August 17, 2015 By Linda Happel

The Meeting was called to order at 1 pm by President Linda Happel. The minutes from the last meeting were available on the back table. Lorna Hunt gave a brief Treasurer's Report and Art Show financial statement. The profits from the show were \$991.47. Congratulations given to the members who were in the show. 50 artists and 112 paintings were accepted in the show and of those 24 artists were members and entered 61 pieces. The members who won awards and present at the meeting were recognized. Members were asked for their thoughts on the positive things and negative things about the show at the fairgrounds. As the discussion was not progressing. Linda stated that the Creekside building was very good for showing the work and she enjoyed pairing with the wineries. Members agreed. The \$5 fee to get into the Award Reception was a negative as was the lack of transportation during the show. Rayna Coller said that she didn't like the paintings hung on the wall with glass because of the glare. Also the signage was incorrect and not enough. There was no real vote on whether to pursue the fair again next year but the feeling seemed to be to have it elsewhere if we could find a reasonable or free venue.

Barbara Conley announced that we would be having a picnic in September at Hurst Ranch. Also Michael Severin would be there to critique and assist those who would like to paint on the Hurst grounds. MLAA will provide drink and table set ups and members are to bring a dish to share. Barbara said that Leslie Hurst did ask that we remove all of our trash from the grounds at the conclusion of the picnic. Chuck Waldman will be doing a demonstration in November and we still need to find someone for October. Members were quizzed and Barbara Farkas said she thought Joy Willow would be a good choice. Barbara stated she would give her a call. Susie Hoffman listed the

members who are going into the various venues and their dates. Two hospital venues are still available and Susie stated she would have the sign up on the back table for anyone interested. It was announced that Rich Linville will be editing our newsletter and thanks were sent to him through his wife, Sulastri. The deadline for news articles is September 5th.

Connie O'Connor announced a new art project endorsed by the California Art Counsel, a state agency, for visual art in Amador, Tuolumne and Calaveras Counties, a tri-county project. The funding from the Ca. Arts Council of \$22,100 must be matched so that either a monetary or "in-kind" donation or pledge to sponsor this project was solicited. Donations must be made by September 5th. Their first project is "AnimalScapes of the Sierra Nevada" and a flyer will be included in the newsletter outlining the dates. These were all changed today so our flyers, which were available on the back table, were not correct. The date for submitting qualifications and samples of work is September 25th. Those accepted will be notified by October 5th. Approximately 45 will be accepted, and for those participants, a piece of art depicting animals/pets/wildlife in the specific backdrops of the geographic Sierra foothill regions, must be submitted by January 4, 2016. TCAA is working on destination for this AnimalScapes show and are interested in showing at Black Oak Casino. Still many things to be ironed out.

Members enjoyed refreshments and then a wonderful demonstration of a landscape in watercolor by Dale Laitinen. Approximately 28 members enjoyed this great demonstration. Respectfully submitted, Linda Happel, Acting Secretary for Renetta Hayes.

The show is finished and it is only August. I, for one, will enjoy having the rest of the year to work on art without making crazed preparations of an art show in October. But of course that is only my thoughts. A first for us this year: presenting our 63rd Annual Art Show in association with the Fair. I do believe many people who would not attend an art show visited and were impressed with the art talent in this area. The Fair Committee was so generous in donating the Creekside Building for our show and also pairing with the wineries and their award winning wines was also a great choice. The building itself was perfect for a wonderful

display of arts and wines and the reception was well attended with Inner Sanctum and Gianelli's providing wine tasting, the Rotary Club selling wines by the glass, and great food provided by the fair. Also special transportation was provided for our reception from the Library and Senior Center by Black Oak Casino. A special price of \$5.00 was given to those attending the reception. The show ran smoothly but member participation at the reception table or raffle table during the show itself was poor. Perhaps that was because of the question of where to park and many not wishing to take public

transportation. The show participation itself was wonderful however. 145 pieces were entered and 112 accepted with 50 artists on display. Of those, 24 artists were members and our members entered 61 pieces. And 18 of our members' art won awards! A special thanks to Rana Ford and Susan Lea Hackett for Plein Aire painting at the fair. TCAA provided book authors who manned

a table in our building and this too was well received. An expansion of the arts.

While Joan Cardoza from Oakdale won Best of Show and Popular Vote as well as two Honorable Mentions, our members shined in the awards category. In the Acrylic and Oils Category Michael Severin was awarded 1st place, Barbara Conley 2nd place, Michael Bowes 3rd and Michael Bowes and Michael Severin also Honorable Mentions. In the watercolor category Honorable Mention Awards went to JoAnn Terry, Pat Gray and Barbara Young. Mixed Media 2nd place award went to Susie Hoffman and 3rd to Pat Gray and HM to

Sulastri Linville. 3 Dimensional 2nd place to Marta Magistrali and 3rd place to Larisa Stevenson. In Pastels 1st place to Rayna Coller, 2nd place to Joyce Schoettgen and 3rd place to Lorna Hunt. Barbara Conley won the Agricultural Art Award and Kitty Davids' Yummy Pears was chosen by the Mayor as the Mayor's Award.

ALL pieces must arrive securely packed and be able to be moved and repackaged multiple times throughout the Project Exhibition Schedules - January through April 30, 2016.

Artists will receive 70% of the sales price of sold pieces!
