Mother Lode Art Association General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Linda Happel at 1 p.m. The chair introduced new member Ron Treadway and Guests Celia Niemerow, Ruth Walter, Michael Bowes, Elize and Esther Gerrels. The minutes of the May meeting were approved by the Board and available for review. The Treasurer's report was presented by Anne Bates. The beginning balance for checking was \$2,738.98 and \$3,199.01 in savings. There were expenses for the month of \$303.90 leaving a checking account balance of \$2,985.02. The chair passed around sign-up sheets for food donations and help during the upcoming Fall Show. It was announced that raffle prizes need to be collected from merchants and asked for sign-ups to take posters and donor requests to the greater Sonora area,

Louisa King, Chairwoman for the Fall Show, reported on the shows progress. She noted very few entry forms have come in with the deadline coming up on Oct. 14th. Delivery of the artwork will be at the Opera House on Oct. 24h She noted that raffle prizes are still needed and can be left in the back room of the Aloft Gallery. Susan Lea Hackett will coordinate the plein air painting during the show by our local plein air painters. They are to contact Susan to let her know they will be painting and check in at the Opera Hall when they arrive to receive their name tags. The group will need easels and tables set up on the patio for their finished product. Susan asked for a person to go around and check on the painters and relieve them as needed. Barbara Conley reported on the Children's Art Show which will be a part of the Fall Art Show. There are two high schools and three elementary schools participating. Panels are being provided for the Children's Art Show by Tuolumne County Arts Alliance. Ribbons and monetary awards will be provided by MLAA. Barbara also reported the MLAA program for October will be Tina Moore, pastelists and November will be Alexis Halstead, ceramicist.

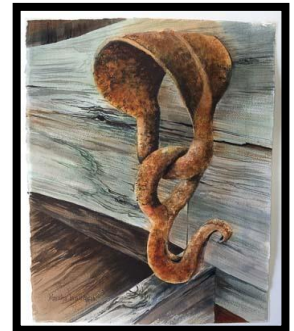

Hoffman will be at Stage 3 but needs more artists. She currently does not have someone for Umpqua Bank or the Aloft Gallery. Susie announced upcoming classes to be held at Town Hall Arts.

Renetta Hayes from the Aloft reported that sales are very good so far this year. The Aloft is currently featuring Michael Severin as a Guest Artist for three months. Michael will be doing a demonstration on 2nd Saturdays and the painting auctioned off at the end of the evening. Julianna Tillman happily won the auction last Saturday.

Michael Severin announced that he will be presenting a three-month class on Wed. starting in January once a week at a cost of \$120.

Our 64th MLAA Art Show is now history and all went well thanks to many of you who volunteered.

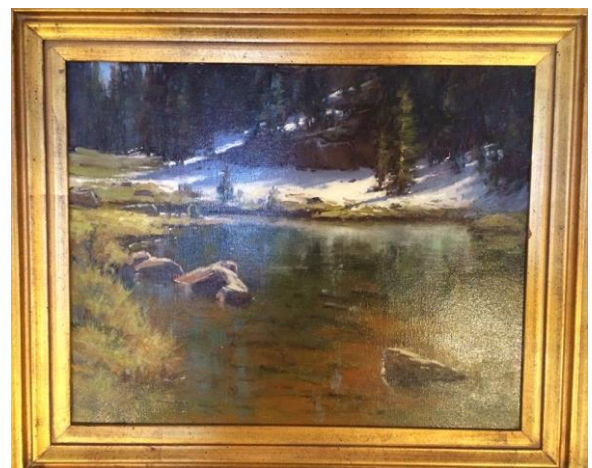
